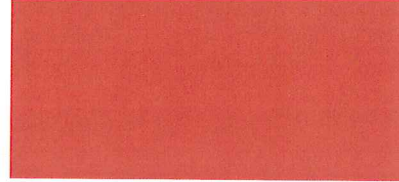


## THE PROGRAM

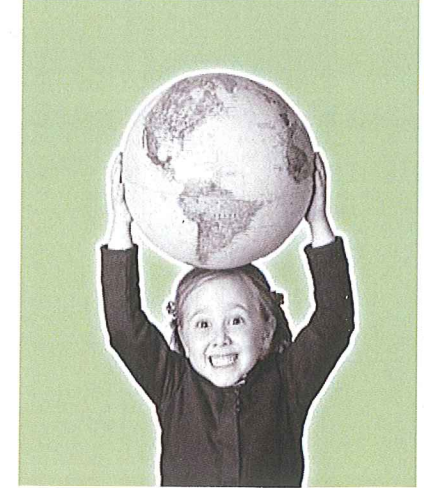
## OUR TREATMENT APPROACH

Under the supervision of Board Certified faculty and advanced graduate students in the Behavior Analysis Program at UNR, intensive treatment in our Home Program is provided by a team of tutors trained in the methods and principles of ABA and Early Intensive Behavior Intervention (EIBI).



## OUR MISSION

The University of Nevada's Early Childhood Autism Program is dedicated to improving the lives of young children with autism and their families through intensive education and treatment according to the scientific principles and established practices of Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA). Whether research, practice, or both, the focus is always on the child and family. With its connection to the Psychology Department and the Behavior Analysis Program at the University of Nevada, Reno, the program is also a Behavior Analysis Certification Board (BACB) training site for students involved in the science and practice of behavior analysis.



## COMPREHENSIVE ABA SERVICES

and reduction include:

- Verbal Behavior Training
- Discrete Trial Teaching
- Fluency Instruction
- Natural Environment Teaching
- Pivotal Response Training
